## Terms and conditions for registering student dependants

- It is possible to cover a child as student dependant if he or she is:
  - under the age of 25
  - not married or living in a de facto relationship
  - not employed as an apprentice or trainee, and
  - attending a full-time course of study at an approved Australian school, college or university.
- We will write to ask you to reconfirm your child's eligibility to remain covered as a student dependant in January each year. If you do not reconfirm his or her eligibility within the nominated timeframe, your child will be removed from your cover and may have to re-serve waiting periods on rejoining.

## Declaration

I have read and understood the terms and conditions for registering a child as a student dependant. I understand that if my child leaves full-time study, marries or turns 25 he or she will no longer be eligible for cover as a student dependant. I will notify rt health fund of any change in circumstances immediately. I understand that rt health fund reserves the right to verify my child's eligibility for cover as a student dependant.
